RV solar sizing is a different approach than what would be done for a home install where we build a system to fit the consumption. We do not have the space in a RV to satisfy max consumption, so we have to fit our consumption into what our system can deliver.

The roof of your RV is like prime real estate, so when deciding what may be the best solar panels for your RV, you must consider size, as well as efficiency. While Amorphous is the cheapest, and does have a high-efficiency rate, it is twice the size of poly-crystalline and mono-crystalline.

If the roof is wide open, full-size residential panels like used on homes can be used for RV solar panels. These are residential 72-cell solar panels installed on this RV The second challenge with non-RV-specific panels is the voltage they operate at.

A 600 watt solar setup is a good size for a couple or small family with a large RV or camper with roof space for the panels. It can support wild camping or boondocking in your RV for long periods year round with careful use and monitoring of the battery levels.

Instead of running 6 wires (3 solar panels for Kelly"s installation, 2 wires per panel) from the roof, all the way to the solar controller (which we opted to install at the front of the rig), the idea is to "combine" the solar panel wiring together into one pair of larger gauge wire.

Battery maintenance is essential to get the most out of your system. Aim to build in a 20-30% cushion too.
